

An alumnus of Berklee College of Music, Ed was mentored by Dizzy Gillespie and Bruce Johnson. Bruce received a Grammy for his work on *Live at Royal Festival Hall*.



Kim Clarke has been a professional bassist for over 40 years, having played with greats like Art Blakey, Mary Lou Williams, Geri Allen, and Yusef Lateef. 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
